Callaway, of NEIS & CALLAWAY, P.C. and the Respondent appearing in person and with her attorney, Deborah S.J. Ward or waiving her appearance, and the Petitioner having testified under oath and having presented other proof in support of his petition, and the Court having examined the record and considered the proof and;


THE COURT FINDS:

- That at the time of the commencement of this action, both of the parties were domiciled in Arizona and such domicile had been maintained for more than 90 days.
- That the conciliation provisions of A.R.S. § 25-381.09 either do not apply or have been met.

- 4. That the marriage between the Petitioner and Respondent has been irretrievably broken.
- 5. That this Court has considered, approved and made provisions for child custody, the support of the minor child, common to the marriage of the parties, the maintenance of either spouse, and the disposition of property.

WHEREFORE, good cause appearing;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED, and DECREED as follows:

- 1. That the marriage previously existing between the parties is dissolved.
- 2. That the Respondent is awarded the care, custody and control of the minor child with reasonable rights of visitation granted to the Petitioner which visitation rights shall be at a minimum as follows:
- a. Every other weekend beginning 8:00 a.m. Saturday and concluding at 5:00 p.m. on Sunday;
- b. Every Wednesday for at least eight (8) hours and the Petitioner shall pick up the child and deliver the child at a place mutually agreed upon by the parties;
- c. The father shall have four (4) extended weekends during the year subsequent to the child's second birthday when the Petitioner will be allowed to pick up the child on Friday morning at 8:00 a.m. and return the child to the Respondent at 8:00 a.m. Monday morning;
- d. The Petitioner shall be entitled to two (2) seven(7) day consecutive periods of visitation during the year so that

e. Holiday periods shall take priority over vacation time and shall be exercised as mutually agreed upon by the parties but if parties are unable to reach an agreement such holiday and special visitation shall be as follows:

Respondent 30 days prior to exercising such extended visitation;

- f. <u>Easter</u>: Mother shall have the minor child from the morning of Easter day until 5:00 p.m. Father shall pick up the minor child that evening at 5:00 p.m. and return the minor child back to the mother by 9:00 p.m. that night. - i. Christmas Day: Father shall have the minor child from 6:00 p.m. on Christmas Eve until noon on Christmas Day. arrangement will start with the odd number years and then reverse itself for the even numbered years.
- k. New Year's Day: Father shall have the minor child from 6:00 p.m. on New Year's Eve until noon on New Year's This arrangement will start with the odd number years and Day. then reverse itself for the even numbered years.
- The minor child's birthday shall be divided between 1. the parties. Mother will have the minor child for birthdays in odd numbered years and Father will have the minor child for birthdays in even numbered years.
- Mother will have the minor child for mother's m. birthday and for Mother's Day. Father will have the minor child for father's birthday and for Father's Day.
- Father may have additional visitation with the minor n. child if mutually agreed upon by the parties.
- Petitioner father shall pay to the Respondent mother 3. \$305.32 per month child support commencing September 1, 1995 and continuing thereafter until such time as the minor child graduates from high school or reaches the age of 18 years of age or there is a material change in financial circumstances of the parties.

- Respondent will get the income tax exemption for the minor child two (2) out of three (3) years beginning in 1995 and 1996 and the Petitioner will get the exemption for the minor child every third year beginning in 1997 unless the parties mutually agree to other arrangements regarding the exemption.
- The parties will exchange financial information including income tax returns and supporting documents at the end of the year every year.
- 6. The parties agree that they will conduct themselves in such a manner as to be conducive to the best interest of the minor child and shall communicate with each other on all important matters pertaining to the child's health, welfare, education, child care, religious education and upbringing, and will notify the other in the event of a medical emergency or other emergency of matter significantly affecting the child's welfare. The parties also agree that neither party will make any disparaging comment about the other party to the minor child.
- 7. Both parties agree not to consume any alcoholic beverage during the periods of time when the minor child is in their physical custody.
- The parties will be responsible for any out of pocket medical or dental expenses in accordance with the portion of their respective incomes as outlined in the child support fact sheet.
 - 9. That neither party is awarded spousal maintenance.
- That each party is awarded as their separate property the property that is presently in their possession.

11. That each party shall be solely responsible for, and hold the other harmless from, any debt he or she has incurred pendente lite.

12. That the parties shall be responsible for their own attorneys fees.
