This matter having come before the Court, the Petitioner appearing in person and with his attorney, William H. Callaway, of NEIS & CALLAWAY, P.C. and the Respondent appearing in person and with her attorney, Deborah S.J. Ward or waiving her appearance, and the Petitioner having testified under oath and having presented other proof in support of his petition, and the Court having examined the record and considered the proof and;

THE COURT FINDS:

1. That at the time of the commencement of this action, both of the parties were domiciled in Arizona and such domicile had been maintained for more than 90 days.
2. That the conciliation provisions of A.R.S. § 25-381.09 either do not apply or have been met.

- 1 3. That this Court has jurisdiction over the minor child.
- 2 4. That the marriage between the Petitioner and Respondent
- 3 has been irretrievably broken.
- 4 5. That this Court has considered, approved and made
- 5 provisions for child custody, the support of the minor child,
- 6 common to the marriage of the parties, the maintenance of either
- 7 spouse, and the disposition of property.

8 WHEREFORE, good cause appearing;
9 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED, and DECREED as follows:

- 10 1. That the marriage previously existing between the parties
- 11 is dissolved.
- 12 2. That the Respondent is awarded the care, custody and
- 13 control of the minor child with reasonable rights of visitation
- 14 granted to the Petitioner which visitation rights shall be at a
- 15 minimum as follows:
 - 16 a. Every other weekend beginning 8:00 a.m. Saturday and
 - 17 concluding at 5:00 p.m. on Sunday;
 - 18 b. Every Wednesday for at least eight (8) hours and the
 - 19 Petitioner shall pick up the child and deliver the child at a place
 - 20 mutually agreed upon by the parties;
 - 21 c. The father shall have four (4) extended weekends
 - 22 during the year subsequent to the child's second birthday when the
 - 23 Petitioner will be allowed to pick up the child on Friday morning
 - 24 at 8:00 a.m. and return the child to the Respondent at 8:00 a.m.
 - 25 Monday morning;
 - 26 d. The Petitioner shall be entitled to two (2) seven
 - 27 (7) day consecutive periods of visitation during the year so that

1 he can take vacations with the minor child and will notify the
2 Respondent 30 days prior to exercising such extended visitation;

3 e. Holiday periods shall take priority over vacation
4 time and shall be exercised as mutually agreed upon by the parties
5 but if parties are unable to reach an agreement such holiday and
6 special visitation shall be as follows:

7 f. Easter: Mother shall have the minor child from the
8 morning of Easter day until 5:00 p.m. Father shall pick up the
9 minor child that evening at 5:00 p.m. and return the minor child
10 back to the mother by 9:00 p.m. that night. This agreement will
11 start with the odd numbered years and then reverse itself for the
12 even numbered years.

13 g. Memorial Day: Mother shall have the minor child
14 from the morning until 5:00 p.m. Father shall pick up the minor
15 child that evening at 5:00 p.m. and return the minor child back to
16 the mother by 9:00 p.m. that night. This agreement will start with
17 the odd numbered years and then reverse itself for the even
18 numbered years.

19 h. July 4th: Mother shall have the minor child from the
20 morning until 5:00 p.m. Father shall pick up the minor child that
21 evening at 5:00 p.m. and return the minor child back to the mother
22 by 9:00 p.m. that night. This agreement will start with the odd
23 numbered years and then reverse itself for the even numbered years.

24 i. Thanksgiving Day: Mother shall have the minor child
25 from the morning of Thanksgiving day until 5:00 p.m. Father shall
26 pick up the minor child that evening at 5:00 p.m. and return the

1 minor child back to the mother by 9:00 p.m. that night. This
2 agreement will start with the odd numbered years and then reverse
3 itself for the even numbered years.

4 j. Christmas Day: Father shall have the minor child
5 from 6:00 p.m. on Christmas Eve until noon on Christmas Day. This
6 arrangement will start with the odd number years and then reverse
7 itself for the even numbered years.

8 k. New Year's Day: Father shall have the minor
9 child from 6:00 p.m. on New Year's Eve until noon on New Year's
10 Day. This arrangement will start with the odd number years and
11 then reverse itself for the even numbered years.

12 l. The minor child's birthday shall be divided between
13 the parties. Mother will have the minor child for birthdays in odd
14 numbered years and Father will have the minor child for birthdays
15 in even numbered years.

16 m. Mother will have the minor child for mother's
17 birthday and for Mother's Day. Father will have the minor child
18 for father's birthday and for Father's Day.

19 n. Father may have additional visitation with the minor
20 child if mutually agreed upon by the parties.


21 3. Petitioner father shall pay to the Respondent mother
22 \$305.32 per month child support commencing September 1, 1995 and
23 continuing thereafter until such time as the minor child graduates
24 from high school or reaches the age of 18 years of age or there is
25 a material change in financial circumstances of the parties.


1 11. That each party shall be solely responsible for, and hold
