It appears Frances Heady was admitted to the hospital on June 10, 1929 and died there on January 29, 1932. If you are interested in viewing the file please be advised of the following:

The Head Start is a pre-school program for disadvantaged children, although it is run by the state I doubt they will be able to give you any information on the TB Sanitarium better known as Uncas-on-Thames. They have small classrooms on the bottom floor of one of the newer buildings on the grounds. The CT Dept of Social Services and TVCCA (Thames Valley Council for Community Action) are also located there.
