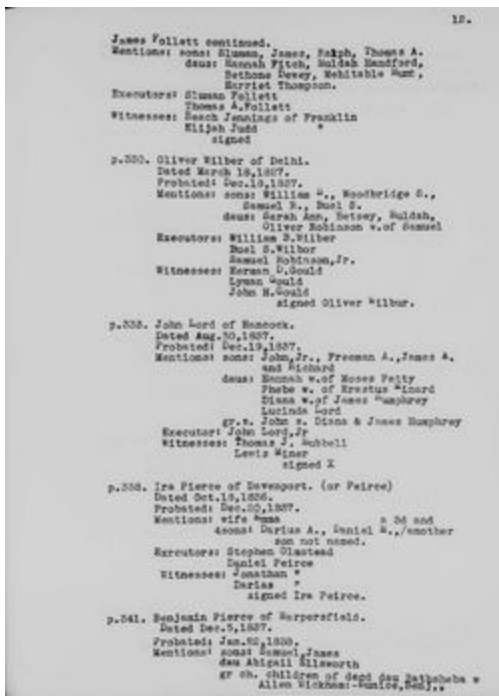

John II was the first settler of Long Eddy Sullivan County NY, making the first clearing on that portion of the flats known afterward as the Adams tract and lately belonging to the Halsey's.

Sold land in Lordville NY for the right of way for the Erie RR in 1835. The Railroad was finished going through Lordville in December of 1848.

Reportedly buried in Stockport NY between Hancock and Lordville NY.

Date of Probate 12/19/1837

334 and publish this my last will and testament (that is to say) First I give and bequeath to my son

Freeman A Lord two hundred acres of land containing thereon my dwelling house wherein I now live

with all the appurtenances which said parcel of land is described as follows --

on the east by the Lot heretofore given and granted by me to my son James Lord --

on the North by a line parallel as may be with the river Delaware as it flows in front of the premises and sufficiently distant to contain two hundred acres of land exclusive of the lot given to Diana below , on the west by the westerly line of my whole lot and a hollow or run passing through the Flatt to the river

and room sufficient on the Westerly bank of said run for the convenient erection and maintenance of a

fence and on the south by the Delaware river . To have and to hold to my said son Freeman A Lord his

heirs and assigns forever --

And whereas I owe divers debts to sundry persons --

My said Son Freeman is charged hereby owing with the payment of each and every debt by me of my

and I expressly enjoin it upon him to satisfy every creditors to the amount

of their just claims in
consideration of which I hereby give and bequeath to him the said Freeman all my personal property of which I may die seized and whereas I have heretofore given granted and conveyed to my Son James A Lord have or parcel of land containing about two hundred and forty acres said gift and grant is to be in
lien of a devise as also in payment of any sum of money to which he might be equitably entitled by
reason of his services rendered to me Also I give to my daughter Diana the small parcel of land
contained between the Delaware river
that run through the flat as above described and the west line of my homestead farm estimated to
contain about two acres more or less To have and to hold to my said daughter Diana (wife of James
Humphry 335 and her assigns for and during the term of her natural life without impeachment or waste , and from and immediately after her decease I give and devise the same to my grand son John 2 Hauseph rey his heirs and assigns for ever Also I will and ordain that the executor of this my last will and
testament or his executor or executor for and towards the performance of my said testament shall with convenient speed after my decease bargain sell and alien in fee simple all those my lands to wit the
Island in the river and nearly opposite the before devised premises and the residue of the home lot in
the rear of the lands before granted and devised to James A Lord and Freeman A Lord for the doing
executing and perfect finishing whereof I do by these presents give to my said executor and his executor or executors full power & authority to grant alien sell convey & assure all the said lands to wit The
Island and the back land to any person or person and their heirs forever in fee simple by all and every
such lawful ways and means in the law as to my said executor or his executor or executors or to his or
their counsel learned in the law shall seem fit and necessary and the proceeds or avails of such sale or
sales to pay as follows To my daughter Hannah (wife of Moses Park) two tenths parts To my daughter
Lucinda three tenths parts To my daughter Phebe (wife of Erastus Minard) three tenths parts To my son
Richard Lord two tenths parts And I do hereby appoint my trusty and well beloved son John Lord

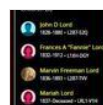
