I have been unable to locate the parents of Henry West Sampson, born in Wayne Co., New York. Although I believe him to be the Henry Sampson located in the following census: His obit states he came to Hillsdale, Michigan in October of 1850-although I believe this to be him/no proof. Charles Sampson 28 Amantha Sampson 25 Elisabeth Sampson 16 Catharine Sampson 14 Mary Sampson 9 Charles Sampson 1 Henry Sampson 18 Elisabeth 51. Brother Charles, sisters, brothers child (Charles) and his mother Elizabeth.

I suspect he helped his family relocate from Ashippun, Dodge, Wisconsin to Greenbush, Sheboygan, Wisconsin not long after the census and then he left to join John Warner Sampson and James B. Sampson in Hillsdale, Mich. He references Greenbush, Sheboygen Co., Wisconsin as where he came from in his marriage license.

He was the husband of Mary Ann Smith buried in King Lake Cemetery and Isabelle Gregg buried in Oak Grove Cemetery. The Father of 18 Children. Per family history his son Orley was a twin.

It appears that he remained in Hillsdale the rest of his life after his marriage to Mary Ann Smith. Per their marriage certificate Henry was from Greenbush, Sheboygan, Wisconsin.

He was married to Mary Ann Smith, April 20, 1856, in Hillsdale, Michigan.

He was married to Isabelle (Isabella) Gregg, December 11, 1864 in Hillsdale Michigan.

I have been unable to locate graves for the twin to Orley or find proof of a twins birth..(info that Orley was a twin was written by Orleys sister, Minnie Florence Sampson, my Great Grandmother) nor have I been able to find Henry's first born son with Mary Ann, Wellington Joel Sampson. He does not appear after the 1860 census when he was 10 months old. I placed him in King Lake Cemetery as that is where his mother, and sisters are buried. Dates of birth and death provided by my Great Grandmother and his sister Minnie Florence Sampson and again in a letter to Minnie from another sister. To date have been unable to find burial records on Wellington.

Oddly Henry named his first child with Isabelle after his first wife but am finding that was done very often in that time.

Per census records Henry was first a Carpenter and Joiner, a Retail Grocer, changed professions and returned to Carpentry.

Henry W. Sampson, aged 90 years and a resident of Hillsdale for 72 years, died this morning about 6:00 o'clock at the home, 72 West Street South. Death was from old age and dropsy. He had been seriously ill about a month.

Arrangements have not been made for the funeral services, but if a daughter in California is not coming, the funeral services will be held Wednesday afternoon. Burial will be in Oak

Mr. Sampson was born April 8, 1832, at Lyons, N.Y. He moved to Oconomowoc, Wis., in 1844. On October, 1850, he came to Hillsdale and has since made this city his home.

He was married to Mary Ann Smith April 20, 1856. She died June 28, 1864. He was married to Isabel Gregg Dec. 4, 1864, and they celebrated their golden wedding anniversary eight years ago. She died on March 5, 1920.

Surviving are nine children, two sons and seven daughters. The sons are Orley D. Samson in the Hillsdale post office, and Charles Sampson of Toledo. The daughters are, Mrs. Minnie Martin, Hamilton City, Cal.; Mrs. Cora Tallman and Miss Lavantia M. Sampson of Washington, D.C.; Mrs. Lizzie Roby of Fostoria, O., Mrs. Bessie Chapple, Flint; Miss Mary Sampson, at home, and Miss Alice Sampson, county drain commissioner. There are also 11 grandchildren and four great grandchildren.


Mr. Sampson was a carpenter and he worked at the trade until a few years ago.




