 occupation Mill hand, do declare on oath that my personal description is:

 height 5 feet 9 inches; weight 159 pounds; color of hair brown;
 color of eyes blue; other visible distinctive marks small blue mark over right eyebrow

I was born in Townaghmore, Ireland on the 15 day of February, anno Domini 1890; I now reside at Sanford Ave., Fairfield, Conn.
 I emigrated to the United States of America from Liverpool, England on the vessel Carmania; my last foreign residence was Normanton, England;
 I am married; the name of my wife is Ellen; she was born at Scotland and now resides at Fairfield, Conn.

It is my bona fide intention to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to George V. King of Great Britain and Ireland

of whom I am now a subject;
 I arrived at the port of Boston in the State of Mass. on or about the 21st day of March, anno Domini 1925; I am not an anarchist; I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy; and it is my intention in good faith to become a citizen of the United States of America and to permanently reside therein: So HELP ME GOD.

(1) My place of residence is 108 Austin St., Bridgeport, Conn. (2) My occupation is Mill Operative
(3) I was born in Townaghmore, Ireland February 15, 1890 My race is Irish
(4) I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on November 15, 1926 in the Superior
Court of Fairfield County, at Bridgeport, Connecticut
(5) I am married. The name of my wife Ellen Kilbride Dunleavy
we were married on April 14, 1921 at Musselburgh, Scotland; She was
born at Oak Bank, Scotland on Dec. 21, 1890; entered the United States
at Boston, Mass. on March 20, 1925 for permanent residence therein, and now
resides at 108 Austin St., Bridgeport, Connecticut I have six children, and the name, date,
and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children are as follows: Annie born November 3, 1922 at Nor-
manton, Yorkshire, England; Gerard born June 8, 1925; Sabina born
April 29, 1927; Ellen born August 8, 1928; Winifred born January 23,
1930 and Theresa born August 12, 1931. Last five children all born
in Fairfield, Conn., U.S.A. and all six children now residing in
Bridgeport, Connecticut, U.S.A.
(6) My last foreign residence was Normanton, Yorksnire, England I emigrated to the United States of
America from Liverpool, England My lawful entry for permanent residence in the United States
was at Boston, Mass. under the name of JAMES DUNLEAVY
on March 21, 1925 on the vessel SS. CARMANIA
as shown by the certificate of my arrival attached hereto.

(7) I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the United States. It is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, emperor, or sovereign, and particularly of God, of Great Britain,

Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas

K. G. Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India,

of whom (which) at this time I am a subject (or citizen), and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States. (8) I am able to speak the English language.

(9) I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since March 21, 1925 and in the County of Fairfield

this State, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since April 21, 1925, being a residence within said county of at least six months next preceding the date of this petition.
