First. My place of residence is _____ 310 Jefferson St., (hereunder, street, city or town, and State.)

Second. My occupation is _____ baker's helper.

Third. I was born on the 25 day of November, anno Domini 1881 at Jardonowka, Austria.

Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Trieste, Austria, on or about the 13 day of November

anno Domini 1910, and arrived in the United States, at the port of New York, on the 29th of November

anno Domini 1910, on the vessel Martha Washington. (If vessel owned otherwise than by name, the character of vessel or name of transportation company should be given.)

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 26th day of December, anno Domini 1922.

Sixth. I am, & I, in the Supreme Court of Kings County

Married. My wife's name is Catherine, she was born on the 25 day of November, anno Domini 1888.

Seventh. I am not a disloyalist in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to The Republic of Poland and/or The Republic of Austria, of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 29th day of November, anno Domini 1910, and in the State of New York, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 29th day of November, anno Domini 1910, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 29th day of November, anno Domini 1910, in the Supreme Court of Kings County, at Brooklyn, N.Y., on the 6 day of December, anno Domini 1922, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit: Lack of Prosecution.

(Pet. No. 35119 and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.)

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavits and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
