I, Andrew Truss, aged 39 years, occupation Laborer, do declare on oath that my personal description is: Color White, complexion Dark, height 5 feet 8 inches, weight 158 pounds, color of hair Brown, color of eyes Brown, other visible distinctive marks None.

I was born in Jardanowka Poland on the 25 day of November, anno Domini 1883; I now reside at 310 Jefferson St, Brooklyn, N. Y.

I emigrated to the United States of America from Austria on the vessel Martha Washington; my last foreign residence was Jardanowka Poland; I am un married; the name of my wife is Catherine; she was born at Poland.

I now reside at 310 Jefferson St Bklyn NY. It is my bona fide intention to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to The Republic of Poland, of whom I am now a subject;

I arrived at the port of New York, in the State of New York, on or about the 29 day of November, anno Domini 1910; I am not an anarchist; I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy; and it is my intention in good faith to become a citizen of the United States of America and to permanently reside therein:

First. My place of residence is 310 Jefferson St. (Give number, street, city or town, and State.)

Second. My occupation is baker's helper

Third. I was born on the 25 day of November, anno Domini 1883 at Jordanowka, Austria

Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Trieste, Austria on or about the 13 day of November anno Domini 1910 and arrived in the United States, at the port of New York on the 29th day of November anno Domini 1910 on the vessel Worth Washington (If the above stated information does not show the character of occupation or name of transportation company should be given.)

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 26th day of December, anno Domini 1922 at Brooklyn, N.Y. in the Supreme Court of Kings County

Sixth. I am married. My wife's name is Catharina; she was born on the 25 day of November, anno Domini 1888 at Meritz, Austria and now resides at with me (Give number, street, city or town, and State.)

Eighth. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to The Republic of Poland and/or The Republic of Austria of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Ninth. I am able to speak the English language.

Tenth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 29th day of November, anno Domini 1910, and in the State of New York, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 29th day of November, anno Domini 1910, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Eleventh. My application for citizenship to the Supreme Court of Kings County at Brooklyn, N.Y. on the 6 day of December, anno Domini 1917, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit: Lack of Prosecution and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.
